Kia ora and welcome to Term 3 2023!

We hope you had a lovely holiday. A special welcome to our new learners and families. We hope you enjoy your time at Takapuna Primary. We have an exciting term coming up with our school production and annual cross country being two highlights.

Key Curriculum Areas

For our Strand Maths this term, we are focusing on Geometry and Mapping. Here we will be learning the language of direction (eg half turn, quarter turn, left, right, forwards, backwards, up and down). Later in the term, we will learn about different types of measurement including volume, weight and money. Throughout the term, we will continue to develop our number knowledge.

In literacy, we are focusing on sentence structure. What a sentence looks like, how we read a sentence and how we can write a sentence. We will continue this focus during reading sessions, narrowing in on punctuation and using expression as the writer intended. As always, we continue to build knowledge of letter sounds and their combinations.

Better Start Literacy is a big part of our reading, writing and phonics program. We encourage learners to read one page at a time. We have created a few videos to share how learners read each page. Notice how the teacher pauses, prompts the learner with help and praises them. A Kakano book example video here. A Tupu book example here. The third video demonstrates how learners can move tiles to make and break (segment and blend) words in a word chain. See this here.

While we are learning our production dance, we are also learning about different elements of dance. These include: body, space, time, energy and relationships.

What's Happening This Term

This term we are working towards our School Production happening at the Bruce Mason Centre. Students and their Teachers are busy practicing their routines and we are all very excited. Class teachers will be communicating with you about any costumes or prop requirements. The show will be on the **evening** of **Thursday 31st of August**. All children are expected to participate. If you are expecting your child will not be able to participate, please let your child's teacher know as soon as possible.

The Kiwi Cross Country will be on Tuesday 12th of September at 2pm. Further details to follow.

Home Learning

We would suggest keeping any home learning light and short (around 15 minutes). The priority would be reading the reading book from school or reading to your child a picture book and talking about what happened in the story and explaining the meaning of new words.
