our families who are new to TPS.

Reading and Writing

This term, Tūī learners will have the first two hours of each day dedicated to Literacy. Tūī teachers will continue to collaborate to teach Reading. In Writing, teachers will be working together to meet the needs of learners. This may mean that your child is learning with a teacher who is not their guardian teacher during this time. Spelling and Handwriting continue to be taught on a regular basis in guardian classes.

Maths

This term we will continue with our balanced approach to teaching Maths. Learners will inquire into how the following concepts apply with hands on materials and real life situations: fractions, mass, probability, place value and symmetry. In addition, we will continue to support learners to develop their maths number knowledge, maths strategies and basic facts.

School Dance Production

The dance production is a major learning focus for Term 3. It forms the basis for our inquiry this term and links with The Arts and Health curriculums. Your child will be learning about the elements of dance, choreography, costumes, props and the skills involved in working together. All classes are busy practising their dance for the show. Your child's guardian teacher will let you know about any prop or costume requirements. Our show day is Thursday 31st August with an evening performance that night. All children are expected to participate. If your child will not be able to participate, please let your child's guardian teacher know as soon as possible. This is a very opportunity for exciting our students who have not been able to be involved in a whole school performance for some years.
