**We are so happy you have joined our school and wish you a warm welcome to our community.**



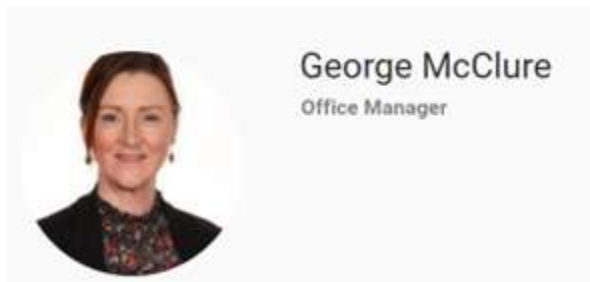

## The Classroom...

Our classrooms are purpose-built modern learning spaces. This means they are big, bright and open. Your child will have one of these spaces as their 'guardian classroom' but they will also move between the other spaces to work with different students and teachers for some subject areas.



Some classroom rules:

- Students may enter the classroom after 8:30am
- Take shoes off before entering the classroom and place them outside in the shoe rack
- Bring their bag inside and put it in a white cubby box - this is their own space to store all their equipment for the day
- Students may leave the classroom to use the toilet at any time, just let the teacher know by making a T sign with hands

## **The Teachers...**

At our school we call our teachers by their first name. You are welcome to go into the classroom before or after school to collect your child, say hello to the teacher and have a look inside the classroom.

## **The Timetable...**

- School starts at 9:00am
- At around 10am students eat a small snack - we call this 'Top Up'. It should be something healthy that they choose from their lunchbox.
- Morning tea is from 11 - 11:30am
- Lunch break is from 1 - 1:50pm
- School finishes at 3pm

Every class may have a different timetable and it changes regularly. The day is based around our core subjects (Reading, Writing and Math) as well as Inquiry. During the week students also participate in Music, PE/Sports, Library, Art and Kapa Haka (Maori performance).

## **School Uniform...**

Our school uniform is compulsory. In Term 1 and Term 4 students must wear a school hat when outside at break times or during class activities such as Sports. In winter months when it is colder, students may wear extra layers underneath their uniform, for example: stockings or a long sleeve thermal, but these must be navy blue or black. Students may wear their own shoes and their own raincoats to school. Socks should be navy blue or black.

There is a size guide to follow for correct sizing. We also sell Second Hand Uniforms via the website. These will not look as new as the photos but they will be in good condition. You can always arrange to have the uniform sent to the school address or your agent. It is best to organise this before you start school.

## **English Language Learning...**

All students who need support with their English are included in the ESOL Program (English for **S**peakers of **O**ther **L**anguages). Students are taught Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing in a small group environment with a qualified specialist English teacher. These groups are held in class time and are included as part of the International Fee. We have a full-time ESOL teacher, Natasha Giles, and a part-time ESOL teacher Emily Ko.

## **BYOD...**

BYOD means **B**ring **Y**our **O**wn **D**evice. Students are encouraged to use their own laptop or iPad for use during school learning time. Students will be set up with their own email account to use for school purposes. All students sign an agreement at enrolment to ensure they know the school rules around correct and safe use of devices. Students will also be required to bring headphones to use with their device.

## **Mihi Whakatau...**

If a student starts within the first week of any term they will be welcomed to our school with a traditional Maori ceremony called a *mihi whakatau*. We invite families to come and share this special ceremony - the beginning of your time in your new community. Students and families meet at the flagpole outside the office at 9am on the first Friday of each term. Afterwards we encourage students and families to join us upstairs in the staffroom to share *kai* (food) together.

## Extra Activities...

Students may join a number of music enrichment groups offered by our Music Specialist teacher including marimba, ukelele, and choir. These groups are at break times and are free. There are also Piano and Guitar lessons available during school time. These lessons cost money.



Our school also has a number of sports on offer, both during school times and after school hours. We have a school pool and in Term 1 and Term 4 students will have 2x 30 minute 'Water Confidence and Water Safety' lessons in the pool. These sessions are during class time and are included in your International Fee.

An After School Care program is also available. Students can stay at the school for any length of time between 3 and 6pm, whilst being looked after by our After School Care staff. Often for International Students this is a good way to improve their English by playing and having fun with others. This program costs money.

## HERO...

We use an App called HERO for all our communication between school and home. Hero allows you to see information about your child, including their school reports. You can see school notices and outstanding fees, you can also make school payments through HERO.

You can download this from the App Store or Play Store.

To create a login, all you need to do is enter the email address you have provided to the school, you'll then be prompted to create a NEW password.

Please ensure that we have your correct email address and correct contact information at all times!

Once you have an account you will be able to receive notices from your child's teachers and the school.

## **Absences, lateness and leaving school early,...**

An explanation for being absent is always required by the school office. If your child is absent from school, please email [absences@tps.school.nz](mailto:absences@tps.school.nz) with your child's name AND reason for absence or call the office on 489 6339 BEFORE 9:00 am.

If your child arrives late after the 9:00 am bell they MUST come to the office and sign in on our tablet, so that we know they're at school. Then they need to take an orange late pass to their teacher to show they've signed in. If they're marked absent on the roll and haven't signed in, you will receive a text message or phone call advising that they are absent.

If you need to pick your child up early, you must also please come to the office and sign them out before you leave the grounds, for the same reasons as above - all students need to be accounted for.

### **School finishes at 3:00 pm..**

Please collect your children promptly. No unsupervised children are allowed to remain in the school grounds after 3:00 pm. If you are late to collect your child, for any reason, please call the school office to let us know. All children who are late being collected will be asked to wait outside the office area. At 3:15 pm we will be ringing caregivers to follow up.

### **Drop-offs, pick-ups and parking...**

Please support us to keep all our children safe around the roads and our school. You can help by parking your car safely and walking to pick up your children. Parking can be very limited around our busy urban school. The parking area on Collins Street is for staff only and not to be used by parents/caregivers. Gates are also locked from this carpark.

## Lunches...

The first 10 minutes of morning tea and lunch are devoted to eating. The children sit in their class groups and eat together, with a teacher supervising, until a bell rings for play time.

Classes pause around 10:00 am for a quick “top up”. The children need a healthy snack for that time, a piece of fruit or vegetable is best.

Suggestions for morning tea include yoghurt, fruit, vegetables, cheese, meats, crackers. Suggestions for lunches include sandwiches, rolls, wraps, rice, pasta, sushi, and leftovers. We are a water-only school and ask that children do not have juice, tea or flavoured milk in their lunches.

You can order lunch to be delivered to the school for your child (please ensure they still bring something for top up and morning tea.) Children call into the office just before lunchtime to collect their order.

From Monday to Thursday lunches are provided by [www.ezlunch.co.nz](http://www.ezlunch.co.nz). Simply register, load money onto the account and then order for your child by 9:00 am on the morning lunch is required. You can set up multiple children under your login and also order several days ahead.

## The first day of school 2024...

***The start date is Friday 2nd February 2024.***

***The first FULL day of school will be Monday 5 February 2024.***

On Friday 2nd February we have a 1 on 1 meeting with the teacher. It is called *Te Hui Whakapiri* in the Maori language which means 'to seek connections'.

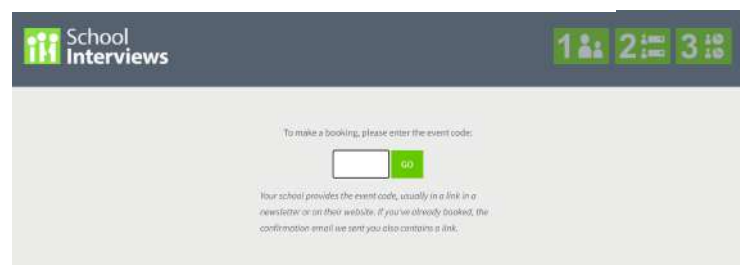
The purpose is to form strong associations between school and families for the year. Families will have the opportunity to book a 15 minute time slot with their child's guardian teacher. Ideally, the family would do most of the talking while teachers listen and take notes. Questions or prompts will be created by the teachers and consistent across the school. These will form the basis of a learner profile for the year.

Please note: Your child will attend school only for this meeting and then go home. Please wear your school uniform.
