Welcome to Term 1, 2024! We hope your family had a relaxing holiday break and enjoyed the wonderful sunshine. We have many new families who have joined us this year and we would like to welcome them to TPS.

# **Reading and Writing**

Kererū learners will have an average of two hours each day dedicated to Literacy. We will be collaborating in Reading this term, so your child may be working with their guardian class teacher or another teacher in their pod (group of classes). In Writing, teachers are teaching the skills of narrative and opinion writing, along with some Poetry. Spelling and Handwriting will also be taught on a regular basis.

#### Maths

We will be incorporating an Inquiry approach to Maths and teaching number strategies along with strand subjects such as Measurement. With our Inquiry, learners will inquire into real life situations with hands-on materials.

#### Inaviru

This comes from the Social Sciences and Histories curriculum. Learners will inquire into their own culture, how they are sustaining it and will teach others an aspect that is important to them. We will also look into the history of the Māori language and culture and its

significance to NZ.

### **Water Skills**

Water Skills is a key and compulsory component of the NZ Curriculum. A note is required if children are to be excused from these lessons.
