#### **Reading and Writing**

We will continue to have an average of two hours each day dedicated to Literacy. Learners may be working with their guardian class teacher or another teacher in their pod (group of classes) for Reading. In Writing, teachers are teaching the skills of narrative, reports and explanation and persuasive and opinion writing.

#### Maths

We will continue to incorporate Inquiry to Maths and teach alongside number strategies. With our Maths Inquiry, learners will inquire into real life situations with hands-on materials starting with Angles, then Measurement.

#### Inquiry
