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# Kia ora and welcome to Term 2 2025

Welcome back to Term 2! We hope you enjoyed the Easter break and like us are looking forward to a busy term ahead. A special welcome to the new families who join us this term we hope you enjoy your time at TPS.

Along with this newsletter, we are sending you a copy of our 'Fridge List'. This is a list of key dates and reminders for this term. We hope you find it helpful. There are a few whānau activities coming up this term including our student-led open morning and our Matariki afternoon. We hope you will be able to join us for some of these celebrations. In addition to our termly team newsletter, a school newsletter will be emailed to you once a fortnight on Thursday afternoons. The next one will be sent out on Thursday 15th May. If you don't receive it please check your spam and then contact the office if you still cannot find it. The school also posts regularly on the Hero app and our website has regular updates about important events. Lastly, your child's teacher will also be sending home a weekly email with reminders for the following week. If you have any difficulty finding any of these information sources please talk to your child's teacher or visit the office where we can help you.

# Key Curriculum Areas

During the first two weeks of the term we will be teaching the Firewise programme. This programme teaches students skills to help them stay safe around fire. More information can be found by clicking <a href="here">here</a>. To complete these studies, the fire service will visit us with their fire truck on Thursday morning 8th May. In week 3 we will take part in Road Safety Week. During this week we are learning about how to stay safe when we are on or near roads. You can read more about Road Safety Week <a href="here">here</a>.

Our **Inquiry** this term will focus on movement and forces. In particular we are learning about how wheels and pulley are used to make things move. The teachers have planned a range of hands on activities to help tamariki explore and understand how wheels and pulleys work and why we have them. Our **Literacy** programmes continue to focus on teaching students the basic skills that will enable them to read, write and develop their oral language and comprehension skills. In Mathematics, we will be learning about the value of numbers, addition subtraction and measurement.

This term during **PE**, Kiwi team students are learning to skip! We will start off with some basic skills such as hoping, jumping and skipping without a rope. Once we have mastered those skills we will move on to skipping with a rope. Along with the whole school we will participate in Jumping June and raise money for the NZ Heart Foundation. We hope you will support us with this.

# Ways to help your child as they learn

- Each day your child will bring home some home learning. Please check their bookbag for this and support your child to complete their work.
- Coming to school regularly and on time helps our tamariki as they settle into school life. A good time to arrive at school is between 8:30 - 8:45 am as it allows time to prepare for the day and spend some time with friends.
