Kia ora and welcome to Term 3 2025

Welcome back to Term 3! We hope you enjoyed the break and like us are ready for a fun term ahead. A special welcome to the new families who join us this term we hope you enjoy your time at TPS.

We welcome Phoebe joining us to support the new learners in 6a and 6b. We appreciate you!

Along with this newsletter, we are sending you a copy of our 'Fridge List'. This is a list of key dates and reminders for this term. We hope you find it helpful. There are a few whānau activities coming up this term including our Cross Country, the 3 way conferences and our Curiosity in Motion open evening. We hope you will be able to join us for some of these celebrations. In addition to our termly team newsletter, we have our school newsletter which is emailed to you once a fortnight on Thursday afternoons. The next one will be sent out on Thursday 31st July. If you don't receive it please check your spam and then contact the office if you still cannot find it. The school also posts regularly on the Hero app and our website has regular updates about important events. Lastly, your child's teacher will also be sending home a weekly email with reminders for the following week. If you have any difficulty finding any of these information sources please talk to your child's teacher or visit the office where we can help you.

Key Curriculum Areas

Last term for **Inquiry** we were learning about the forces of motion in science, including push and pull. This term we are using this knowledge to go through the design thinking process, to make something as a class. To begin this Technology journey, we have invited the Museum of Transport and Technology (MOTAT) to visit Whanau Kiwi at school. They have something called <u>STEAM Cells</u>. This is where their teachers come to our school and bring a whole lot of items from MOTAT in a trailer, so that we can learn from right here at school. They will be joining us on Tuesday 28th of July and Wednesday 29th of July. Each class will visit them for a learning experience called *Invent-a-machine*. From there, classes will work towards making something to share at the Curiosity in Motion evening on Tuesday 9th September.

Our **Literacy** programmes continue to focus on teaching students the basic skills that will enable them to read, write and develop their oral language and comprehension skills. This term, the Year 1s will have a colour wheel book for part of the week. This will help with understanding about the book and learning about different experiences. In **Mathematics**, we will be learning about different ways of making a number, addition, subtraction as well as measurement and geometry.

We had a great time last term skipping! This term during **PE**, the learners will be learning small ball and big ball skills and the sports that relate to those skills. We are also preparing for our Cross Country by practicing the skill of endurance, while running. The Cross Country will be on Friday 22nd of August. You are welcome to join us.

The Kiwi teachers have been excited to plan some **Music** and **Dance** lessons for our
