CURRICULUM

This term promises to be full of imagination, expression, and creativity! Our Inquiry focus is "Lights, Camera, Action!" where we'll explore the world of drama, from storytelling and character development. Students will be given a kiwiana story to act out in groups, working together to bring characters and scenes to life through expressive voice, movement, and teamwork - all performed right here in the classroom.

In Physical Education, we are focusing on Athletics, Water Skills for Life, and small ball skills. Water Skills for Life is an important life skill for all our students considering we are an island surrounded by water.
